#### Mathematics

We follow a Mastery approach to teaching maths and this term we will be focussing on:

- Multiplication and division (3s, 4s, and 8s)

#### Rocks, Fossils and Soils:

As part of their learning, the children will find out about different kinds of rocks and what they can be used for, explore a variety of soils and find out how they are formed, discover the fascinating world of fossils, as well as undertaking a variety of experiments to get their Science skills rock solid!

Forces and Magnets: The children will be:

- classifying forces as a variety of pushes and pulls, including contact and noncontact forces.
- investigating magnetism and magnetic materials whilst devising their own enquiry questions.
