## **Mathematics**

We follow a Mastery approach to teaching maths and this term, we will be focussing on:

- Shape
- Position and Direction Statistics
- Negative numbers .
- Decimals ٠

#### Science

Forces - children will continue to learn about types of forces. They will learn about the use of mechanisms such as levers, gears and pulleys, and find out about Isaac Newton and his discoveries about aravity. Animals Including Humans children will learn about the different stages of the human life cycle from development in the womb to old age.

## Computing

Microbits – children will create programmes to use on controllable devices using inputs and outputs. Selection In Quizzes – children will desian, create and evaluate programmes which use selection.

#### French

Café Culture - children will be learning about the culture of going to cafés in France. They will start by learning the nouns for food and drinks you can order in a French café, then practise saying which food they like or dislike and create a menu for a French café.

Let's Celebrate – children will create their 'read all about it' newspaper style piece of writing. The children will then explore a mocktail recipe and write their own including ingredients and instructions.

#### Art

Street Art - children will learn how graffiti has become an art form and develop their own techniques to create street art using stencils.

## RE

How Do Christians Decide How To Live? What Would Jesus Do? children will identify features of Gospel texts and how these help Christians live their lives.

How Can People In Cornwall Express Their Spirituality Through **The Arts?** children will explore the ways in which people in our local community use the arts as a way of expressing their connections with spirituality.

#### **Music**

You've Got A Friend – using 'You've got a friend' by Carole King as a stimulus, children will explore ballads and pop songs, and how they are composed. Music And Me – this unit will focus on inspirational women working in music. Children will explore the concept of 'identity' and how music can be used as a form of expression.

DT Moving Toys - children will investigate cam mechanisms, design, make and test their own moving toys with a cam mechanism.

#### PE

Following our Complete PE Scheme, in PE this term, we will be focussing on **invasion** with ultimate frisbee, net/wall games with tennis, athletics and orienteering and developing striking and fielding with cricket.

# **PSHE**

Being My Best - the focus will be on children identifying their strengths and talents, being part of a community and exploring how the media portrays people. Growing And Changing - children will explore different types of feelings, identify strategies to use in difficult situations and consider how we change as we develop into adults.

# Ancient Greece/Global Trade

# **History**

**Ancient Greece –** children will investigate how we know so much about the Ancient Greeks, look at evidence to help us understand more about their everyday lives and consider the ways in which the Ancient Geeks have influenced our lives today.

#### Geography

**Global Trade –** children will explore how and why trade has become alobal, investigate stages of the supply chain and study what is imported and exported in the U.K.

The Day the Crayons Quit - children will explore the features of persuasive writing and create their own persuasive letters using the book as a stimulus for writing.

**The Tempest –** children will share a version of this classic play by William Shakespeare and write diary entries after exploring characters.

Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael

Morpurgo – children will read the story and create their own poetry. They will also look at the story from the perspective of other characters. Survivors by David Long – after reading this story, children will write recounts from a different perspective.

Reading and listening to your child read every night makes a big difference to their progress in all areas of learning. Reading for pleasure is something we strongly encourage at school, and we always welcome discussion about books and poetry in class. Please reinforce this love of reading at home with your children and ensure that they bring their reading books to school each day. Along with opportunities to read for pleasure in class, children will take part in more formal reading comprehension sessions where we will focus on developing reading skills, such as inference, vocabulary choices and authorial intent. During these sessions, we will explore a variety of fiction, non-fiction texts and poetry.
