Sustrans Workshops and School Streets Project

The sustainable transport charity Sustrans were back in school this week to continue their street design project looking to reduce congestion and improve safety around the school at the start and end of the school day. They built on the feedback received in January to design solutions with the school community. Sessions were run with pupils during the day and with residents, parents, and staff members in the evening. The turn out and level of interest was fantastic and a big thank you to all those who took part.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

As part of this project there will be a trial timed road closure along the road in front of school from the junction with Fore Street to the junction with Gover Hill (St Agnes Road). This will start after the Easter holidays, beginning on **Tuesday 22nd April**. During the trial, only authorised vehicles will be able to use the road at the start and end of the school day between 8-9am and 2:30-3:30pm. Outside of these hours, the road will be open as normal.

The trial aims to reduce congestion and traffic speed at the start and end of the school day and create a safer environment, allowing families to walk, wheel or cycle.

If you currently drop off or pick up pupils by car, we ask you to consider parking further from the school and travel actively for the final leg. This will help disperse traffic and alleviate traffic pressure near to Rodda's Road - in front of school.

We appreciate your support with this and although change can initially be challenging, hopefully this trial will lead to a safer environment outside the school. During the trial, the school drop off will only be used by those requiring permits. Further information to follow.
