Mathematics

We follow a Mastery approach to teaching maths and this term, we will be focussing on:

- Place Value
- Addition and subtraction
- Multiplication and division
- Fractions

Science

Living things and their habitats -. Children will investigate sexual and asexual reproduction and study the life cycles of animals, insects and plants. They will look at the significance of the work of Sir David Attenborough and Jane Goodall.

Properties and changes of materials- children will compare and aroup everyday materials based on their properties. They will investigate changing materials and explain the differences between reversible and irreversible change.

Computing

Systems and networks – children will explore the roles of computer systems in our lives.

Video Editing – children will identify devices that can capture video and explore the features of an effective video.

Art

Frida Kahlo- Children will learn about the life of this artist, study some of her work and explore surrealism as an art style.

British Dishes - Children will investigate national dishes and learn about the influences of, and similarities between cuisines from other countries.

French

Revisit me/telling the time/everyday life - Children will describe feelings, recap personal information, tell the time and describe everyday life.

Homes and houses - Children will describe rooms in a house. different furniture and will look at a spooky house story.

Music

We will follow the Charanaa focused around one song: Happy by Pharrell Williams - a Pop sona with a Soul influence about being happy.

What does it mean to be Muslim in Britain today? - Pupils will explore Muslim beliefs about God, the Prophet, and the Holv Qur'an.

Incarnation – Why do Christians believe that Jesus is the Messiah? Pupils will study the Incarnation and Messiah within the 'big story' of the Bible and how Christians put their beliefs about Jesus' Incarnation into practice in different ways in celebrating Christmas.

Following our Complete PE scheme unit, 'Happy'. This unit is Scheme, in PE this term, we will be focusing on our **Invasion** skills in netball and tchoukball, and in **Gymnastics** we will concentrate on matching and mirroring. We will also look at leadership in **Outdoor** Adventure Activities.

PSHF

Me and my relationships – children will explore emotional needs and feelings, how to be a good friend and being assertive.

Valuing differences - children will discuss recognising celebrating differences, and the influence and pressure of social media.

Enalish

Grammarsaurus (The Place Value of Punctuation and Grammar) - Children will be focussing on different areas within grammar, starting with a noun focus and then moving onto verbs and finally subject/verb focus.

Pandora - Children will be exploring features of effective non chronological reports and then researching and writing their own.

Rain Player – Children will use this book by David Wisniewski to write a newspaper report.

Reading

Reading and listening to your child read every night makes a big difference to their progress in all areas of learning. Reading for pleasure is something we encourage and we always welcome discussion about books and poetry in class. Please reinforce this love of reading at home with your children and ensure that they bring their reading books to school each day. Along with opportunities to read for pleasure in class, pupils will take part in more formal reading comprehension sessions where we will focus on developing reading skills, such as inference, vocabulary choices and authorial intent. During these sessions, we will explore a variety of fiction, non-fiction texts and poetry.
