
Science Challenge

paper towels,	2.	Fold the coffee filter in half.	
peg,	3.	Decorate above the mark with markers.

water-soluble markers,	5.	Fold the coffee filter in half twice and put it in the cup.

molecules get dissolved. Some of these colour molecules are smaller and lighter than others, so they move at different speeds. That's why the colours look separate!
