Welcome to Gwithian Class - Autumn Term 2025

Mathematics

We follow a Mastery approach to teaching maths and this term we will be focussing on:

Year 2: place value to 100, counting in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s, addition and subtraction across a 10 and recognising and naming 2-D and 3-D shapes.

Year 3: place value to 1000, addition and subtraction across a 10 and 100 and multiplying and dividing by 3, 4 and 8. We will be learning the 2, 4 and 8 times-tables.

Science

We will be exploring the human skeleton and muscles and answering questions, such as how do bones protect our bodies and why do humans have muscles?

Computing

We will begin by learning about digital devices and transferring information between devices. After half term, we will then complete a unit on programming and sequencing.

Art

We will be completing a unit entitled 'Monochromatic Art'. We will be learning how this style of visual art utilises variations of a single colour (hue) to create a composition.

DT

We will be completing a unit of work on 'Special Foods'. We will be learning how to cook a variety of foods, using a range of healthy ingredients.

Music

We will follow the Charanga scheme. As well as learning to sing, play, improvise and compose, we will listen to a variety of songs and reflect on what we have heard, thinking about the style of music.

RE

We will start the year by exploring foods that are special to different faiths. After half term, we will learn about the Hindu festival of lights, known as Diwali.

PE

In PE this term we will be completing units of work on netball and handball. We will also enjoy a gymnastic unit, based on symmetry and asymmetry, followed by a gymnastic unit focussing on linking movements.

English

We will begin by completing units of work focussing on 'The Place Value of Punctuation and Grammar'. We will then write a non-chronological report about the human body.

Phonics

Year 2: will continue this term, with the 'Little Wandle for Letters and Sounds' phonics programme. They will bring home their spot book for the week.

Year 3: will consolidate their learning of phonics, by completing the Little Wandle Spelling units and completing fluency reading sessions in school. Year 3's will bring home a Big Cat reading book for you to practise at home.
