How Plants Grow

As part of their learning, the children will find out about identifying and describing the functions of the roots of flowering plants. Thinking of a test to show the way in which water is transported within plants. Identifying and describing the functions of leaves in flowering plants. Exploring the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal. Looking at how plants disperse their seeds. Finally, they will look at the parts of a seed and why are seeds an important food source for animals.
