Mathematics

We follow a Mastery approach to teaching maths and this term we will be focussing on:

Science

<u>Animals Including Humans – Health and</u> <u>Movement</u>

How do humans get the nutrition they need from what they eat? Are bones in animals the same as human skeletons?

Light and Shadow

The children will learn about how light travels, what shadows are, how the length and position of a shadow changes throughout the day and much more.

The children will learn to appreciate the work of Dutch artist, Vincent Van Gogh. The children will know how to use colours and lines to create shade and movement, develop their sketching techniques and create portraits in the style of Van Gogh.

<u>DT</u> Moving Monsters

The class will investigate a range of simple pneumatic systems in which they will gather ideas to create their own moving monster toy. Based on their testing and findings, they will create their own moving monster by following their annotated designs. Finally, they will evaluate their work to determine what went well and how they could make it even better.
