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


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Going Home Arrangements

TRY THIS OUTDOORS Looking for Lichens

Look closely at the trees around you – can you see anything growing on the trunks or branches? If so, you might have spotted some lichen. There are may different types of lichen, but by identifying which species you have found, you can learn about the quality of the air nearby. Some types of lichen struggle to grow in polluted air, while others grow well. WHAT DO YOU NOTICE?

Things to talk about ... Which types of lichen did you find growing near roads? Which types of lichen did you find not near a road, or in green spaces like a park?



Lichens consist of two types of organisms - a fungus and either an alga or a type of bacteria - that live together and depend on each other. The fungus makes the body that protects the alga/bacteria, and the alga/bacteria provides the food for the fungus. Common types to look out for: **Hypogmnia** has large, green-grey lobes, but it won't grow where there is air pollution; **Usnea** looks like a green beard and is usually found hanging from tree branches. It indicates a clean-air environment as it doesn't like the nitrogen found in polluted air. **Cushion Xanthoria** is bright-yellow or orange lichen. It loves nitrogen so it is an indicator of polluted air.
