Chromatography is the process of separating colour pigments.

| Colours are made up of molecules! The coffee filter absorbed the liquid, and the colour molecules get dissolved. Some of these colour molecules are smaller and lighter than others, so they move at different speeds. That's why the colours look separate! | | |
