E-Safety

In our PSHE lessons, and regularly at other times too, we work with our children to help them understand how to keep safe online and treat others with respect too. It can be very easy online for children to behave in a way that they wouldn't if they were face to face with each other. We talk to them about how they are speaking to others online and encourage them to talk to people online with respect and kindness, like they would if they were face-to-face. Dr Linda Papadopoulos (Internet Matters Ambassador) provides tips on how you can help your child to be kind online in this YouTube video, such as teaching them how to be inclusive and think about how they would like to be treated online themselves: Video Link

Ensure that your child understands that if they receive unkind messages (or see something that worries them) then they should not reply or engage in conversation with them, but that they should tell a trusted adult. You can use the tools within an app to report any offensive or hurtful content as well as block people so they cannot contact you again in the future.
